Written proposals must include the following: Name, current address, phone number and a copy of current business license.

CARNIVAL RIDES:

1. Contractor must provide a cost estimate of what it will take to operate ride(s) for the entire one (1) month duration of the 2007 Liberation Carnival. In the event that more than one ride is proposed, then a separate cost for operation should be included for each ride.
2. **THE RIGHT OF EXCLUSIVITY** will not be entertained to ensure that a variety of rides are available to the public.
3. There will be only one (1) bid awarded per each type of carnival ride.
4. Individual power meter hook-ups and payments for each ride will be the sole responsibility of the ride concessionaire.
5. Safety Certificates must be displayed for the public to view throughout the entire carnival period.
6. Safety Certificates by GPD / OSHA, must be obtained no later than June 22, 2007. Failure to obtain safety certificates from the proper Government of Guam departments will forfeit operations.
7. Each carnival ride **that is mechanical**, the operator shall be required to obtain General Liability Insurance not less than \$100,000.00 per person and \$300,000.00 per incident. The 2007 Liberation Executive Committee shall be named the insured. Proof of insurance shall be provided to the 2007 Liberation Executive Committee no later than May 22, 2007 (commencement of building concession booths).
8. All decisions by the Executive Committee are final.

JUMPERS:

1. There will be only one (1) bid awarded per each type of jumper.
2. Individual power meter hook-ups and payments for each jumper will be the sole responsibility of the jumper concessionaire.

2007 LIBERATION DAY CARNIVAL CONCESSIONS COMMITTEE BIDDING RULES & REGULATIONS

The following are the Rules & Regulations established for the 2007 Liberation Day Carnival Concessions bidding process. Failure on the part of prospective bidders to adhere to these Rules & Regulations may result in the disqualification of their bid(s).

1. Bid packets will be made available at the our website at www.liberation2007.guam.gov, AB Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam, or PNB Building 5th Floor, Directors Office, from May 1, 2007 to May 25, 2007.
2. Each bid packet will contain one (1) Bid Form. Please be advised that only one (1) bid may be submitted on each form. If you wish to bid for more than one (1) concession you will have to make copies of the bid form for each bid you want to submit. "Package Bidding" will not be allowed or accepted.
3. When submitting your bid, please include a deposit equivalent to twenty percent (20%) of the bid price and a copy of your business license. Personal checks will not be accepted. If paying by cashier's check, certified check or money order, please make payable to:

4. Bids must be sealed and will be accepted until May 25, 2007, 5:30 pm, at the AB Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam, Conference Room #2 & 3.
5. Opening of bids will begin on May 25, 2007, 6:00 pm. Announcing / Awarding of the bids will be held on May 29, 2007, 3:00pm at the A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority, Guam Conference Room No. 2&3. Mailed-in bids will be accepted if postmarked by May 22, 2007. Please mail to the following:

6. Bids for beer sales and / or gambling activities must have an attached authorization from an active, non-profit organization. The non-profit organization shall then be verified for its authenticity and current legal status by the Department of Revenue & Taxation. This certificate must be attached to the bid form before any award may be given.
7. Non-profit organizations must have filed their current year end financial statements and balance sheets with the Department of Revenue & Taxation. They must also have a list of the organization's officers and members on file with the Department of Revenue & Taxation at the time of the bid opening.

8. Bids for a game and objective of skill must have a separate sheet attached detailing the name of the game, the game rules and objective, the type of prizes to be awarded to winners, and any other information necessary to assist the committee to better understand the game and to determine the award for bid. Game directions shall be type-written on an 8 ½" x 11" sheet of paper.
9. Bidders who file as a sole proprietorship must have their current gross receipt tax and current financial statements at the time of the bid opening to ensure prompt issuance of license. Failure to file may result in penalty and payment of interest with the Department of Revenue & Taxation.
10. Winning bid shall be awarded based on the highest bid price submitted for each category as determined during the opening of the bids.
11. Winning bidders will be notified and then issued an award certificate upon receipt of full payment of the Bid Price Balance and Security Deposit (non-refundable). A contract will be signed by each awarded bidder, who will then be given approval to begin construction of the concession booth(s).
12. All balances and fees for Concession Booth(s) are to be made in full May 29, 2007, 3:00pm at A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority, Guam Conference Room No. 2&3. No late payment will be accepted. There are no exceptions to this rule.
13. In the event a bid has been awarded and the bidder is unable to submit payment in full, on or before, May 29, 2007, at 3:00pm, then such bid shall be disqualified and deposit forfeited. The offer shall then be made to the next highest bidder. In the event there is no successful highest bidder, the bid shall be offered publicly, provided, however, the bid price for that particular bid category is no less than the other awarded bids for that category, or the minimum bid price, whichever is highest.
14. Should any disputes or concerns arise, between or among, Carnival Concessionaires during the hours of operation's, the 2007 Liberation Day Carnival Grounds Manager will have the final say as to how the dispute will be resolved or how the concern will be addressed.
15. Storage containers are absolutely prohibited on the Liberation Day Carnival Grounds. The Grounds Manager will identify a staging area for storage containers.
16. Bidders who have outstanding debts / bills with the Liberation Day Committee will not be allowed to participate in this year's Liberation Day Carnival until said debt / bill is paid or settled with this year's Liberation Day Carnival Committee.
17. In the matter of late entries, provided we have space available, will be available only if bid submitted is equal to, or greater than, the current highest bid amount that has already been awarded.

18. The 2007 Liberation Day Carnival Committees reserve the right to accept or refuse any bids. The decision of the 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee is final.
19. In case of an unexpected Typhoon, inclement weather and or power/water outages/glitches, the 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee, along with the Carnival Committee will not be responsible for any loss of revenue or damages sustained that may be caused by the inclement weather or unexpected typhoons and or power/water outages/glitches. All concessionaires shall be solely responsible for any loss and or liabilities that may be sustained from the inclement weather or unexpected typhoons and or power/water outages/glitches.

**2007 LIBERATION DAY CARNIVAL CONCESSIONS
RULES & REGULATIONS FOR
CARNIVAL GROUNDS**

PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. APPLICABILITY AND SCOPE

These Rules & Regulations shall apply to the 63rd Liberation Day Carnival held at Guam Island Fair/Liberation Day Festivities at the Paseo Grounds, under the control, management and operation of the 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee, hereby to be referred as Executive Committee.

B. DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply to the provisions contained in these Rules & Regulations.

1. **“Carnival”** – An organized program of entertainment and exhibition which involves the erection of any tent or similar structure requiring the use of heavy equipment and heavy erection bases on wheels, poles, stakes or columns which must be driven into the ground.
2. **“Executive”** – The Executive Committee of the 63rd Liberation Day Carnival.
3. **“Committees”** – A group of people who were appointed to organize the 63rd Liberation Day Carnival or property owned and controlled by the Department of Parks and Recreation of the Government of Guam. It shall also mean an organization that operates exclusivities for cultural and recreational activities promoting, producing, staging or conducting events, productions, attractions or activities for the island of Guam.

PART II. SPECIFIC PROVISIONS

C. CARNIVAL SITE

Only those listed in Enclosure I may use Paseo Grounds as the Carnival site. The organization must obtain approval from the Department of Parks and Recreation prior to applying for a carnival permit for the Department of Parks and Recreation.

D. DURATION OF CARNIVAL AND DEBRIS REMOVAL

The duration of the carnival held at the Paseo Grounds shall be limited to (30) calendar days or as specified by the Executive Committee. Setting up of carnival equipment shall begin no earlier than the date specified on the Schedule of Events approved and listed on the Carnival Bid packet. Vendors shall be responsible to notify the Department of Parks and Recreation and Benny Pinault, Carnival Committee Chairperson, if they will be drilling into the ground / asphalt. Such carnival equipment shall not be brought onto Paseo Grounds premises earlier than the set up time limitation. Carnival equipment taken down shall be completed and equipment removed from Paseo Grounds premises no later than five (5) days after the final day of the carnival. Noncompliance will result in the forfeiture of the security / clean-up deposit. All vendors are responsible to remove all

necessary debris (i.e., tires, tins, lumber, etc.) upon completion of the carnival. The Executive Committee may limit the duration of the carnival to less than three (3) days if the carnival is expected to be disruptive to the general community.

E. INSURANCE

The Executive Committee will identify a listing and shall require the concessionaires to obtain insurance. They shall present to the Executive Committee a Certificate for Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, in the following amounts:

- 1. Carnival Rides:**
 - \$100,000.00 per person
 - \$300,000.00 per incident

The 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee shall be named as an additional insured. Proof of Insurance shall be provided to the 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee no later than May 25, 2007 (commencement of building of booths).

Concessionaires shall see that their insurance policy contains the statement “the 2007 Liberation Day Executive Committee is named as an additional insured” and that the coverage shall begin from the carnival equipment set up date to the completion of the taking down and removal of all equipment. In addition, it shall be the responsibility of the organization and the carnival operators to provide adequate equipment barricades and / or security guards for safety purposes.

F. VEHICULAR TRAFFIC AND PARKING

The Executive Committee shall hire off duty Guam Police Department Officers or other security personnel through the Request for Proposal (RFP) or a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) processes (off duty Guam Police Department officers or other security personnel) to control and restrict vehicular traffic inside the carnival grounds. Only necessary vehicles shall be allowed inside the carnival grounds. Parking on grass areas shall be allowed only after receiving specific authorization from the Carnival Committee. All vendors shall utilize the vendor’s pass provided by the Carnival Committee and shall display the parking pass on their vehicle dashboard for two vehicles that they are allotted. All vendors are required to provide a full description of their vehicles to the Carnival Committee and a listing will be provided to the security personnel to ensure accountability and control of parking in the designated parking areas. Any vendor not in compliance will be assessed a towing fee and have their parking passes revoked.

G. DEPOSITS

A 20% deposit is required when submitting a bid in the form of a cashier’s check, certified check, or cash only. Personal checks will not be accepted.

H. FEES

Subject to approval by the Executive Committee, all fees required for the cleanup and utilities shall be paid in full as specified and approved by the Executive Committee to ensure the cleanup and restoration of the carnival facilities from any damages resulting from and / or limited to the general public and vandalism. Any Carnival Concessionaires needing three phases for their freezers, ice machine, etc. will solely be responsible to pay and coordinate their hookups with the Guam Power Authority.

I. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The sponsoring organization shall be responsible for monitoring and controlling noise levels generated by the carnival machinery, loudspeaker system, and other equipment in order to comply with the noise code. The 2007 Carnival Committee may impose additional conditions as deemed necessary for the protection of the Paseo Grounds property and health, safety and convenience of the general public, to include requiring the 2007 Carnival Committee to provide additional portable toilet facilities and police security.

J. CARNIVAL BID PACKETS

The concessionaires shall obtain a Carnival Bid Packet at GIAA 3rd floor, no later than May 25, 2007 and for unsold booths no later than May 29, 2007, prior to the Carnival Bid Opening.

Bidders who file as a sole proprietorship must have filed their current gross receipt tax and current financial statements at the time of the bid opening to insure prompt issuance of license. Failure to file may result in a penalty and payment of interest with the Department of Revenue & Taxation.

Bidders, whose bids are accepted, will be notified and then issued an award certificate upon receipt of full payment of the bid price balance, the one-time utility charge, and the clean-up assessment (non-refundable). A contract will be signed by each award bidder, who will then be given approval to begin construction of the concession booth(s) upon submission of their clearance application from the Guam Power Authority (GPA) and the Department of Revenue & Taxation.

All balances and fees for concession booths are due and payable on May 29, 2007. No late payment will be accepted. There will be no exceptions to this rule.

In the event a bid has been awarded and the bidder is unable to submit payment in full on or before May 25, 2007, then such bid shall be disqualified and the deposit forfeited, and the offer shall be made to the next highest bidder. In the event there is no successive highest bidder, the bid shall be offered publicly, provided, however, the bid price for that particular bid category is no less than the other awarded bids for that category, or the minimum bid price, whichever is higher.

The 2007 Carnival Committee and the 2007 Executive Committee reserves the right to accept or refuse any bids. The decision of the Executive Committee is final.

K. TRASH RECEPTACLES

The 2007 Carnival Committee shall be required to furnish containers and clean-up services throughout the carnival grounds through a Request For Proposal (RFP) for trash containers and clean-up services throughout the carnival grounds. It shall be the responsibility of the responsible party to monitor, collect, and control the disposing of all trash collected

L. CARNIVAL GROUNDS MANAGER

The Carnival Committee shall identify a Carnival Grounds Manager to manage the daily operations of the carnival grounds. Should any disputes or concerns arise between or among the carnival concessionaires (vendors) during operational hours, the Carnival Grounds Manager will have the final say upon the approval of the Executive Committee as to how the dispute will be resolved or how the concern will be addressed.

M. OUTSTANDING DEBTS / BILLS

Carnival concessionaires that have outstanding debts / bills with the 2006 Liberation Day Executive Committee will not be allowed to participate in the 2007 Liberation Day Carnival until the debt / bill is paid / settled with said Committee. Any concerns in this area, please contact Robert Camacho, Executive Chairman 473-7022.

N. STORAGE CONTAINERS

Storage containers are absolutely prohibited on the carnival grounds. The Grounds Manager will identify a staging area for storage containers. Any and all refrigerated containers approved by the Carnival Committee, stipulates that all vendors would be responsible to coordinate with GPA for their own utility hookup that will be separate from the Committee's utility lines.

O. CONCESSIONAIRES (VENDORS)

All concessionaires who are awarded a booth shall conduct themselves throughout the duration of the carnival in a courteous and professional manner. They are responsible to secure their personal articles, prizes, and booths prior to leaving the carnival grounds.

P. BOOTH APPEARANCE

All concessionaires who are awarded a booth shall join in with the Carnival Committee to decorate and dress-up their booths promoting the commemoration of Guam's 63rd Liberation Day Anniversary, **UTILIZING THE RED, WHITE & BLUE COLORS.** The following is recommended for decoration and painting as follows:
